In Year 2, each week it is expected that:

- Your child reads for 10 minutes daily please fill in the section in the Reading Record to show that you have heard them read, this also helps us to know when your child's book needs changing.
- Learns spelling words sent home on Mondays

The Practical Home Learning grid will be stuck into your child's homework book and it would be wonderful to see as many children as possible completing the activities to gain the certificates.

Spring I

English

This term, the children will be exploring different poems by Michael Rosen and will have a go at writing their own poem about daydreams.

Towards the end of the term, they will read 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of The Dark.' by Jill Tomlinson and write their own animal adventure stories.

Vocabulary

Onomatopoeia, rhythm, rhymes, repetition, word play, verses, paragraphs, punctuation, description.



Mathematics

The children will continue to use manipulatives to support them to multiply and divide and then look at data handling (statistics). We will also continue to practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Vocabulary

Multiplication, repeated addition, division, sharing, grouping, barcharts, data, pictograms.

Computing. Multimedia

The class will use an increasing variety of tools and effects in paint programs and create an electronic book.

Vocabulary programme, online, tools, effects, electronic book, sound/music, animation.

Religious Education How do Christians belong to their faith family?

What can we learn from Christianity about family/relationships? Pupils will explore how Christians celebrate together?

Vocabulary:
Baptism, belong, belonging, chalice, Christening,
Communion, faith, font, worship, Jesus

Science Animals including humans

The children will learn about animals including humans exploring how they grow and develop. We will investigate different ways of grouping animals based on animal characteristics, what they eat, how they reproduce, and where they live.



History <u>Nurturing Nurses:</u>

We will be exploring the difference between hospitals in the past and now. Pupils will also learn about Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole.

Vocabulary hospital, nurse, war, women, skills, cause, significant, bravery, Crimean war, soldier, famous, wounds.



Geography Why do people leave their countries?

We will look at why people might leave their country and what it means to be a refugee. We will explore famous people who were refugees.

Vocabulary:

Country, migration, Natural Disaster, refugee.



Art and Design Be An Architect

Pupils will become familiar with the term 'architecture' and familiarise themselves with significant architects.

They will construct 3D forms and then reflect upon this process.

Vocabulary

Architect, Architecture, model, scale, imagination

Design & Technology Structures

Children will learn about different types of structures found in the natural world and in everyday objects. They will make a structure according to some design criteria and then test and evaluate their structure.

Vocabulary

design criteria, man-made, natural, properties, structure, stable, shape,

We will explore the definition of bullying and its impact. The children will develop strategies to support themselves or others.

Music
