English

The children learn about life on the Galapagos Islands, beginning with descriptive writing in the style of David Atteborough. Then we learn how to write with persuasion as we study environmental issues and write an advert for it

We are really looking forward to our class reader, *Asha* and the *Spirit Bird*, which has lots of cross-curricular links to other subjects.





Computing.

We build on our coding skills by learning about nested loops. We'll look at song lyrics and drawings to help us do this.

Vocabulary: loop, nested loop, repeat, function.

Science

We will begin exploring the properties of materials in terms of hardness, response to magnets, transparency and conductivity. We will complete investigations to find out about dissolving and learn how to separate mixtures by filtering, sieving and evaporating.

Vocabulary: dissolving, reversible/ irreversible change

Mathematics

We will begin by revising place value and number, before moving onto the four operations again, this time looking at word problems.

After these units, we move onto learning about time and then shape.


Art and Design

Children explore the work of architects and individual builder/designers, and use sketchbooks and drawing to collect, process and reflect upon ideas. Children then go on to build an architectural model of their aspirational home or tiny house, before sharing as a class to see the village that has been made.

Key vocabulary: architecture, design, still imagery, imagination,

Design & Technology

We start a new unit on mechanisms. In this unit we will learn how cams work and where they are used. We will design and make our own toys using a working cam mechanism. Vocabulary: mechanical, cam (round, egg, snail), friction drive, follower, phase, support, strengthen



Flourish Lesson

We focus on relationships: how we form them, build them and repair them. We will link this heavily to online relationships (communities, gaming and screen time). **Vocabulary:** attributes, self-esteem, responsibility, risks, choices, safety, mental / physical health.

PE

We will be focusing on Athletics this term (running, jumping and throwing). Our other session will be swimming.



French

Using the French words for items of clothing pupils will match spoken vocabulary to both pictures and words. They will produce sentences in response to questions.

Vocabulary includes some of the following: Les vêtements, une casquette, je porte, une veste, des gants, un short, il porte

Religious Education

How do Hindus make sense of the world? We will look at the concepts of Samsara, Karma and Ahimsa.

Vocabulary: Atman,

Braham, Caste system

Braham, Caste system, Moksha, reincarnation.



History

We will learn about the Viking Struggle with the Anglo Saxons for the Kingdom of England. We will find out where the Vikings came from, how they travelled and why they were able to invade Britain so easily. We will investigate the reasons the Vikings migrated from their own country and compare it to migration today.

Key Vocabulary: Struggle, migration, Danelaw, kingdoms, Danegeld, Kings, rampaging, pillaging, raids

Geography

We learn about the physical geography of The Galapagos Islands - focusing on volcanoes and oceans.

Key Vocabulary:

volcanoes, dormant, active, extinct, location, terrain, land use, hemisphere, current, environmental issues.

Music

We will learn the song 'Dancing in the Street' by Martha and the Vandellas, a Motown band from the 1960s. We will use pitched instruments to support our singing and appraise other Motown style songs.

Vocabulary: soul, groove, riff, hook, backbeat, tempo
