Year 1 - Elm Autumn Curriculum Newsletter

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you had an enjoyable and restful summer and are looking forward to an exciting first term in Year 1. The children have begun exploring the classroom and learning our routines and expectations in Year 1. I am Miss Flower and will be teaching the class every day.

On Monday afternoon Mrs Lawrence and Miss Del will be teaching the class to cover my planning time. Miss Del will be teaching the children PE during this time.

We are very fortunate to have several Teaching Assistants supporting the children this year: Mrs Hobbs – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday
Mrs Howe-Ward – Monday, Tuesday am, Wednesday am, Thursday am
Miss Batchelor – Wednesday pm

Myself and our TA's will be holding a 'Meet the Teacher' event after school on **Thursday 12th September** 3.00pm-3.20pm for you to come and meet myself, learn a little more about life in Year 1 and ask any questions you may have.

Homework

Children are expected to read every day at home. Please note any reading in their reading record and this will be celebrated and praised in school with dojo points.

We will be sending home termly challenges that will support the learning that is taking place in class across this term. These are optional tasks, however small amounts of learning at home make connections in their learning and make a difference to your child's knowledge retention.

PE and Welly Day

PE will be every **Monday** afternoon, please ensure your child comes to school dressed in the correct PE uniform, details of this can be found on the school website.

Welly Day will be on a **Friday** afternoon. Can your child come to school wearing suitable, **old** clothing with **long sleeves/ trousers and a coat**. 
























Year 1 Curriculum Map – Autumn Term


English

The children will be using their phonics to develop their confidence in writing for different purposes. This term we will focus on writing lists, labels, captions and beginning to retell familiar repetitive stories. All our learning is heavily supported by interesting and exciting books.

Key Vocabulary: Capital letter, finger space, list, label, caption, question mark.







DT

This term the class will practise using scissors to cut along lines and cut out shapes. They will learn to evaluate a range of paper toys and fold accurately to create a paper toy.

Mathematics

The children will be exploring the key mathematical concepts of Place Value, Addition, Subtraction and Shape. To develop greater understanding the children will explore and answer problem solving and reasoning questions verbally in full sentences.

Key Vocabulary: addition, subtraction, equal, more, less, greater, positional and size language, shape language

Computing. E-safety and Data Handling

This term we aim to introduce basic E-safety skills. The children will learn about potential dangers and what steps to take to keep safe. We will also teach the children the necessary skills to log onto the iPad, scan a QR code and open apps. The children will then progress onto gathering, recording and presenting

Key Vocabulary: I-pad, Login, Password, Safe, Private, Programme, Save, Online, Trusted adult, Email, Search, Data, Represent

Geography What is this place like? - My class, My School, My Road.

This term we will begin to use first hand observations and experiences of the school area to develop contextual knowledge of 'place'. The children will begin to develop map and fieldwork skills in the context of their environment. Children will use maps to talk about everyday life such as where they live, school, journeys.

Key Vocabulary: Aerial view, Floor plan, Observe, Address, Route, Surroundings, Village, Town, Map

Religious Education What do Jewish people

remember on Shabbat?

This term we will be learning about the Jewish story of creation and relate it to observing Shabbat. The children will explore how Shabbat is celebrated as a weekly tradition for Jewish families.

Vocabulary: Havdalah candles, challah bread, creation, Jew, Jewish, Judaism, Kiddush cup, Menorah, Shabbat, Synagogue, Theology

Science

Human Body and Senses

This term we will begin to explore our bodies including naming body parts, our skeleton and the five senses in the human body. The children will carry out investigations to develop a greater understanding of the senses and talk about their findings using scientific language.

Seasons

In Autumn 2 the children will then identify the four seasons by exploring the world around them. They will begin to learn about plants and be able to understand and identify deciduous and evergreen trees.

History Toys from the Past

This term we will explore concepts such as similarity and differences, old and new and changes through time. The children will begin to understand and use common words related to the passing of time: 'in the past', 'the olden days'. The children will explore a variety of toys of different ages and begin to develop the skills to

Key Vocabulary: Then, Now, Past, Present, Old, New, Toys, Change, Future, Timeline, Artefact.

Flourish

The children will explore the feelings associated with being in a new class. We will look at feeling special, safe and proud. We will celebrate the

differences in everyone and focus on how to make new friends and show kindness.

Art

Spirals: This term the children will explore simple ways to use drawing, collage and mark-making to explore spirals. The children will be introduced to the work of artist Molly Hasland.

PE

Pupils will continue with their learning in Reception and this term we will concentrate on basic movements and spatial awareness. We will be developing our ball skills including sending, rolling and throwing.
